





Tuesday 4th July 2023 '...Practise hospitality.' (Hebrew 13.12b)

'But when you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends, your brothers, or relatives, or your rich neighbours; if you do they may invite you back and you will be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind and you will be blessed.' (Luke 14:12-14)

Dear Friends,

Some things are so obvious they don't need saying. And those things get taken for granted, and then, over time, they can get forgotten. So sometimes it's worth stating the obvious application to welcome visitors, even though I think all 3 churches in the benefice are wonderfully warm and welcoming places. I remember one very cross lady telling me she would never go back to one of our churches because everyone was so infuriatingly friendly and kept coming up to her to say hello! I tried not to look delighted!

However, for the sake of stating the obvious, I'm going to remind us that showing hospitality as a church family means that any visitor on their own on a Sunday morning is a pastoral emergency - worth interrupting almost any conversation for, so that we can go and welcome them properly, and perhaps introduce them to others if we feel we're going to struggle to talk to them on our own. A wise friend of mine once said to me 'small talk is big talk', and he meant that the kind of questions we ask when we first meet someone, listening carefully to the answer, and looking for points of connection, really matter in showing care for them. ('Hello, I'm Fred, can I ask if you've been here before? Do you live nearby? What brings you along this morning/evening? Do you know anyone else? Can I introduce you to Philomena?...').

Sometimes, however, the implications aren't quite so obvious. How about this surprising advice from Mez McConnell, a Church planter in the Scottish schemes? He tells churches that if they want to help people escape poverty, they should stop their mercy ministries like food banks, warm banks and so on. Why? Because he's worried people can so easily be treated as projects - 'People can tell when we are happy to share the church's food with them, but wouldn't share our own.' I don't know if his advice is right or not, but it's certainly a huge challenge to me. He wants us to show hospitality to those in need by sharing our lives with them. Of course, we need to show proper care in safeguarding the vulnerable as we do that, but it's a beautiful chance to reflect the kind of invitation to the Heavenly Banquet that the Lord Jesus gives to spiritually needy people like us.
